Knowledge	<p>Pupils should be taught about great artists, architects and designers in history Explore the roles and purposes of artists, craftspeople and designers working in different times and cultures.</p>			
Generate ideas Exploring and developing ideas	<p>Create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas. Select and record from first hand observation, experience and imagination, and explore ideas for different purposes. Question and make thoughtful observations about starting points and select ideas to use in their work. Explore the roles and purposes of artists, craftspeople and designers working in different times and cultures. – All terms</p>			
Make	<p>Improve their use of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay] Experiment with ways in which surface detail can be added to drawings. Use sketchbooks to collect and record visual information from different sources. Draw for a sustained period of time at an appropriate level. Breadth of study Work on their own, and collaboratively with others, on projects in 2 and 3 dimensions and on different scales. Use ICT. Investigate art, craft and design in the locality and in a variety of genres, styles and traditions. – All terms</p>

Drawing	<p><u>Drawing Lines and Marks</u> Make marks and lines with a wide range of drawing implements e.g. charcoal, pencil, crayon, chalk pastels, pens etc.</p> <p>Experiment with different grades of pencil and other implements to create lines and marks. <u>Form and Shape</u> Experiment with different grades of pencil and other implements to draw different forms and shapes. Begin to show an awareness of objects having a third dimension. <u>Tone</u> Experiment with different grades of pencil and other implements to achieve variations in tone. Apply tone in a drawing in a simple way. <u>Texture</u> Create textures with a wide range of drawing implements. Apply a simple use of pattern and texture in a drawing.</p>			
Painting	<p>Painting Experiment with different effects and textures inc. blocking in colour, washes, thickened paint creating textural effects. Work on a range of scales e.g. thin brush on small picture etc.</p> <p>Create different effects and textures with paint according to what they need for the task. <u>Colour</u> Mix colours and know which primary colours make secondary colours Use more specific colour language</p> <p>Mix and use tints and shades</p>			
Printing	<p><u>Printing</u> Create printing blocks using a relief or impressed method</p> <p>Create repeating patterns</p> <p>Print with two colour overlays</p>

3D	<p><u>3 D form</u> Plan, design and make models from observation or imagination</p> <p>Create surface patterns and textures in a malleable material</p> <p>Use papier mache to create a simple 3D object</p>			
Collage	<p>Collage Experiment with a range of collage techniques such as tearing, overlapping and layering to create images and represent textures. Use collage as a means of collecting ideas and information and building a visual vocabulary.</p>

Digital media	<p>Digital Media Record and collect visual information using digital cameras and video recorders. Present recorded visual images using software e.g. Photo story, PowerPoint. Use a graphics package to create images and effects with; <u>Lines</u> by controlling the brush tool with increased precision, Changing the type of brush to an appropriate style e.g. charcoal. Create <u>shapes</u> by making selections to cut, duplicate and repeat. Experiment with <u>colours and textures</u> by making an appropriate choice of special effects and simple filters to manipulate and create images for a particular purpose - Covered in Yr 4</p>			
Evaluate Evaluating and developing work	<p>Compare ideas, methods and approaches in their own and others' work and say what they think and feel about them</p> <p>Adapt their work according to their views and describe how they might develop it further.</p> <p>Annotate work in sketchbook.</p> <p>Record final products, thoughts and evaluations on seesaw</p> <p>Stick sketchbooks into topic books to show art in the topic.</p>
