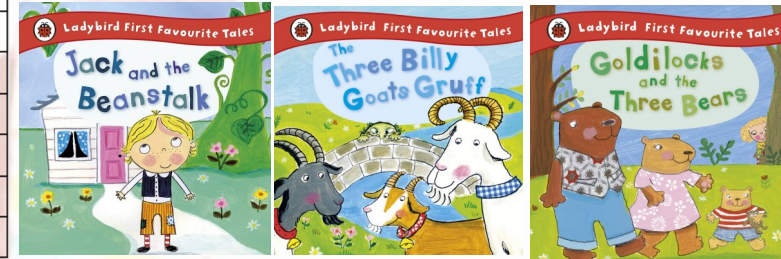

Character	A person or an animal in a story
Hero/Heroine	The main character in a story. Is usually good and well liked.
Villain	The opposite character to a hero. The villain could be mean, nasty, or evil.
Setting	Where the story is taking place.
Fiction	Stories that describe imaginary people and events

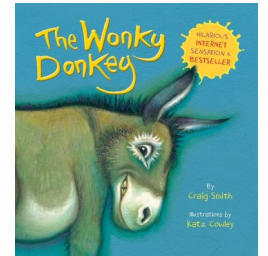
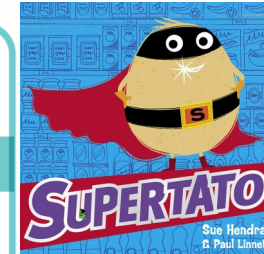

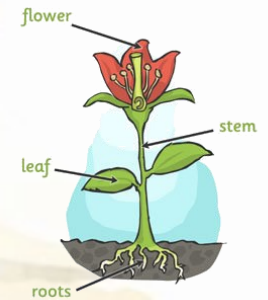
